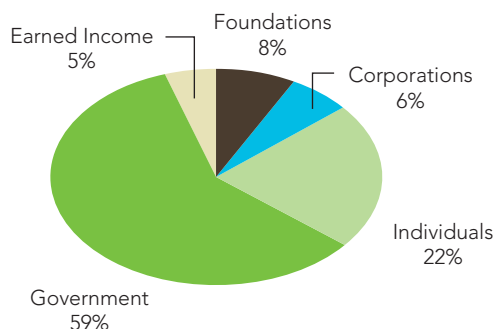

Summary of Audited Financials as of December 31, 2010

84% of each dollar spent went to our programs!

Though the weak economy made fundraising a challenge, Friends of the Urban Forest was able to increase its services in fiscal year 2010 thanks to an excellent level of efficiency. We planted 1,105 street trees in neighborhoods throughout San Francisco, cared for 4,062 street trees, and created 48 employment opportunities for at-risk youth through our Youth Tree Care program—all increases over 2009.

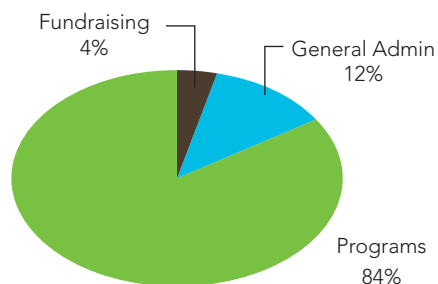

Our Sidewalk Garden program boomed this year as we replaced 3,128 square feet of concrete sidewalk in the Mission with drought tolerant plants, California native plants, permeable pavers and trees. We thank the EPA and the City of San Francisco for providing funding.

Besides being beautiful and bringing neighbors together, sidewalk gardens capture water that could otherwise fill sewers and pollute the bay and ocean during a rainstorm. Next year we'll add more sidewalk gardens in the Islais Creek, Channel and Sunset watersheds, helping to recharge groundwater. We'd love to see San Francisco pump local water, and decrease its dependence on water imported from the Sierras!
